First for the Future

On February 1, our congregation launched the most ambitious capital campaign in its history. For over six years now, a succession of three committees have described the need and the importance of addressing the problems created by the aging Mellin-Macnab Building. Now over fifty years old, the Mellin-Macnab Building has served as the hub of the educational, administrative, and outreach ministries of the church all these years. Three schools meet there: our own church school, the First Presbyterian Nursery School, and our unique public/private partnership with the New York City Department of Education – P.S. 226, our school for autistic children. It is also the home of a homeless shelter occupied six nights a week, a large number of 12 Step groups, an Ethiopian Evangelical Church, and an after-school program for children in P.S. 41. Every day, Good Shepherd Services provides continuing education for teachers, social workers, and others who provide direct support to city residents.

Over the years, the Mellin-Macnab Building has grown in use and its systems have been taxed to the point that they no longer serve the congregation and the community in the ways it was first conceived. We have run out of classrooms and need more, our church offices are scattered over five floors, the dreams of improving our Nursery School are prevented by poorly organized space and lack of storage. Our lobby is too small, dark

and unaccommodating of the many people who use it every day, from child caregivers to people waiting for counseling or spiritual support.

The plans for the future will modernize classrooms, provide code conformity for handicap accessibility, and replace the aging infrastructure of plumbing, electricity, and environmental conservation that were never planned for the use we now give our buildings. It is an exciting plan!

Already, over \$10,000,000 has been committed to the project through early pledges of support. Now the entire congregation is invited to meet the challenge of the future by making a financial commitment over the next five years to support the *First for the Future* campaign, supporting the remainder of the \$15,000,000 goal needed to complete the project. You will be hearing more about this campaign in the coming weeks and be asked to make a sacrificial financial commitment to the future of the church. I hope you will welcome a visitor into your home when you will have an opportunity to learn more about this campaign and the important role you can play in building the future at Old First.

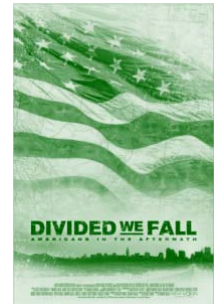

This year marks the 10th anniversary of the Guilmant Organ Recital Series at First Presbyterian. The series honors the founding of the Guilmant Organ School at First Presbyterian in 1899. The Guilmant School was the first accredited organ school in America to offer degrees in organ playing and sacred music. The Guilmant School remained active at First Presbyterian for about 60 years. Mark your calendar and bring friends to these two Sunday afternoon musical events.

The first recital on Sunday, February 8 is presented by Jared Lamenzo, a former organ scholar at First Presbyterian. Mr. Lamenzo is currently Organist and Director of Music at Old St. Patrick's Cathedral located in Little Italy. His delightful program offers all styles of music from the Renaissance to the late 19th-century colorful sonorities of Brahms.

On Sunday, February 22, Ellen Goff Entriken, soprano; Sebastian Gluck, recorder; and William Entriken will offer a program of Handel's music on the anniversary of the birth of the master (February 23, 1685). The program will feature famous arias from Handel's oratorios, sonatas, and concertos. In addition, works by other composers, that have been influenced by Handel, will be performed.

The Adult Committee for Education will host a panel discussion on this topic in partnership with Greenmarket, a program of the Council on the Environment of NYC (CENYC).

Greenmarket is one of the largest and most successful open-air farmers markets program in the country connects local farmers with city residents by delivering fresh healthy produce to all five boroughs. Greenmarkets 46 market locations allow New Yorkers to purchase fresh fruit, vegetables, and other locally produced products straight from regional farmers.

Greenmarket supports family farms, preserves farm land, delivers fresh healthy produce to those who need it most, and reduces the environmental effects that result from food traveling across the country or world.

REMEMBERING JOHN RODGERS

The Reverend John Rodgers was a much beloved and respected religious figure in his day—a “people’s pastor” who served as the Senior Pastor of “Old First” on Wall Street for well over forty years. An ardent and early supporter of the American war for independence, he was an opponent of slavery and advocate for the abolition of debtors’ prison. In

1789, he was elected the first Moderator of the General Assembly of the newly formed Presbyterian Church in the U.S.A. If Old First can be called the “Mother Church” of Presbyterianism in New York City, John Rodgers can rightly be called its “Pastoral Father.”

DAVID PULTZ will speak on the topic “The Reverend John Rodgers and the Church of the Patriots” at First Presbyterian Church on Thursday, February 12, 2009 at 6:30 p.m. in the Great Hall. David S. Pultz has been a member of First Presbyterian Church since 1985 and has served as elder, deacon, and church archivist. He has worked in the motion picture business for over thirty years. His accomplishments include completion of an award-winning feature documentary, “Eternal Memory: Voices from the Great Terror,” and editing a collection of sermons titled “A Preaching Ministry: Twenty-One Sermons Preached by Harry Emerson Fosdick at the First Presbyterian Church in the City of New York, 1819 - 1925.”

The presentation is sponsored by the New York City Council of the Presbyterian Historical Society (PHS). The Presbyterian Historical Society is the national archives of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) and the primary historical research center of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). Myra Tobin, a member of First Church, serves on the Board of Directors of PHS. Everyone is invited.

On **Ash Wednesday, February 25**, we officially mark the beginning of the Lenten season. There will be two communion services at First Church: midday prayers at 12:00 noon and an evening service at 7:00 p.m. in the sanctuary. The Rev. Barbara Davis will preach.



Also on Ash Wednesday, the midday and Wednesday Worship services will include the imposition of ashes, an ancient sign of the frailty and uncertainty of human life. The Presbyterian Book of Common Worship provides for the imposition of ashes as a ritual that belongs to the whole church, not just to the more "liturgical" churches. At the service, those who wish to participate will be invited to come forward for marking the forehead with the sign of the cross and the words from Genesis 3:19, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

Ash Wednesday is a day of repentance, but it is also a call to reflection, meditation, prayer, and preparation. We prepare and turn toward God, so that we are ready for the renewal that awaits us. It is the prayer of the Psalmist that puts our wish to words:

*"Create in me a clean heart, O God,
and renew a right spirit within me." (Ps. 51:10).*
